Grief & Bereavement Program

While grief is a pervasive process, it is unique to each of us. The experience is impacted by personal history, current circumstances, the relationship with the deceased, and the death itself. Our team of clinical professionals provide those who have experienced a death loss, a safe space to process their grief. Clients are matched to available services and supports based on their unique needs and grief experience. Services are offered in both individual and group formats and are available to adults, children, and families.

EDUCATION & CONSULTATION

Our team supports professionals in social service and healthcare settings who work with the Jewish community by providing education about Jewish cultural and spiritual needs at end of life and during bereavement. GROUP SUPPORTS

We offer two types of group supports; loss specific groups that provide education to participants, and therapeutic groups where participants have the opportunity to process and share emotions related to their grief.

Educational Groups:

- Educational materials and strategies to normalize the grieving process
- The knowledge and skills needed for healthy coping

Therapeutic Groups:

- Create a safe space for persons who experienced a more complex or traumatic loss
- Provide the opportunity for participants to process their feelings related to loss, and share their experiences in a supportive environment
- Connect educational materials to participants' lived experience
- Are facilitated by Masters level Social Workers

Group participants are provided with an assessment prior to admittance to ensure the group meets their needs.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all who have experienced a recent death.

INDIVIDUAL GRIEF COUNSELLING

This service is designed for those who experienced a recent loss. Individual grief counselling is provided by Masters level Social Workers. Many of our services are available at no cost. We provide:

- Support for children, adults and families
- Psychoeducation about grief and bereavement
- A culturally attuned approach to grief
- Connection to resources in the community
- Spiritual support
- Services available in English and Russian

Recently bereaved clients living in the GTA who identify as Jewish.
